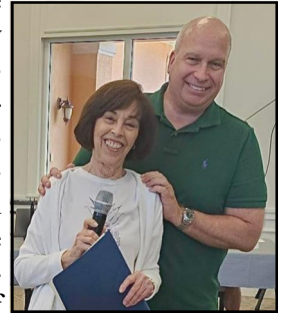
Marge Forrest Honored For Decade Of Service

On March 8th, a special presentation on The Lakes 2024 Reserve Study was made by Jonathan Seal, Senior Project Manager from Association Reserves. He was the lead project manager for our Study which included accessing, measuring and photographing various “components” in our community. Component examples are the clubhouse roof, pool heaters & sports courts.

Overall, Jonathan’s presentation was clear and concise, providing us a wealth of information. Included was a definition of Reserves: “Money that an association saves over long periods of time for large repairs and replacement projects.”

A Reserve Study is a budget planning tool which identifies the state of the Reserve Fund over future years to offset anticipated future major expenditures.



Jonathan also reviewed for those in attendance the details of The Lakes Reserve Study. He noted that The Lakes has 75 components which is more than most HOAs. For each component both remaining life and estimated costs were identified.

A major item of the Reserve Study is the percent funded, which, similar to a credit score, measures risk. This percentage provides a snapshot of the associations long-term financial health. The Lakes percent was identified within the range of having a low risk of needing a special assessment. The study specifically states that “No Special Assessment” has been recommended.

The study identifies both minimal/baseline as well as alternate/100% annual contribution requirements to the Reserve Fund, shown over a 30-year period. During our next budget cycle, we will take the Reserve Study findings into account.

Our Favorite Recipes

Bev Rothmeier's Chinese Coleslaw

16oz. pkg. shredded cabbage w/carrot (coleslaw mix)
4 green onions, thinly sliced
3oz. pkg. chicken flavored Ramen noodles, broken up
1/2-3/4 cup slivered almonds, toasted
1/2-3/4 cup sunflower nuts
1/2 cup salad oil
1/3 cup vinegar
1 tablespoon sugar
1/8 teaspoon ground black pepper

Combine coleslaw mix, green onion, ramen noodles (set aside season packet for the dressing), almonds and sunflower nuts in a bowl. Chill (covered) until serving time (up to 1 hour).

For dressing: In a screw-top jar, combine oil, vinegar, sugar, pepper and seasoning from noodle pkg. Cover and shake. Chill until serving time. Before serving, shake dressing, pour over salad & toss.

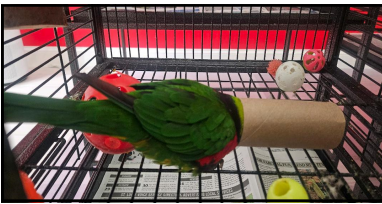

Walking in the front door, you are first greeted by two magnificent white stone panthers at rest! Then you hear the welcoming parrot sounds of Jasper, Rocky, Smokey, Salty, and Pepper. These five siblings and their mom, Meryl, reside in a vibrantly decorated home on Northland. Each bird is approximately 12-13 years old according to their DNA traced upon their re-homing. Joe, Meryl's late husband, was a lifelong nature lover introducing her to many bird species throughout their time together.



Jasper is a Lory. He sports red plumage across his cheeks and throat that flows into a dark blue chest capped with green and bronze wings and ends with a glorious golden tail. He is quite the character enjoying whatever enrichment Meryl provides for him including an empty roll of toilet paper. At the end of the day when Meryl vacuums the room, Jasper will put his head into that empty roll either because he doesn't want to say "nighty, night" or because he is bothered by the noise. It is a hilarious sight!



Rocky and Smokey are Greys that are known to be among the smartest birds in the world, possessing cognitive skills equal to that of a 5 year old child. Smokey, an African Grey, is very verbal and can be considered "the leader of the

pack." She still mimics Joe's voice calling out for Meryl. She also lets it be known if she is not getting enough attention by tossing her toys around the cage. Rocky, a Timneh, is smaller than Smokey but is her best buddy. Greys are known to form close, human-like bonds with their owners. They both enjoy sitting near or on Meryl as she works, watches TV, and reads. Smokey, who snuggles just like a cat or dog, often falls asleep while sitting near Meryl.

A pair of Caiques, white headed Salty (a male) and black headed Pepper (a female), share a cage. Without a nest present, they have not (fortunately) reproduced. These two do not speak but spend time preening each other and performing trapeze stunts. Salty enjoys spreading his colorful wings when he is happy.

A health focused mom, Meryl ensures that all the birds get their daily dose of fruits and veggies first followed by nuts, seeds, and protein appropriate to their species. Each cage has hanging "toys" which the birds pick at as an activity to trim their beaks and stay active. She also ensures that music or the news plays on the radio when she is not home to keep them engaged and speaking. If they need medical attention, she brings them to an Avian Veterinarian in Loxahatchee and to Birds on Safari for grooming and boarding when she travels.

Their home is filled with engaging sounds and love for one another!

The City of PSL puts over 200 volunteers to work in many different departments, such as the Building Department, Neighborhood Services, Finance, or Parks & Recreation, to name just a few. Over 53,000 volunteer hours were logged from 2022-2023, which saved the city 1.7 million dollars. The city has a need for people who can apply their background, experience, knowledge and skills to available volunteer opportunities.

If you prefer to be outside, there's always a need for volunteers at the Saints Golf Course, or you can volunteer with Pickleball, coordinating tournaments and getting equipment ready. If your background includes Event Planning, you may enjoy working at the MidFlorida Event Center in guest services. If office work is your thing, there are scanning and filing jobs as well as jobs preparing mailings by folding and stuffing envelopes.

Apply in person at the front desk in city hall, where you can complete a paper application. A background check is required, but more than likely, you'll be able to start within a week or so and can create your own schedule. Applicants must be at least 16 years of age. You can also apply online at:

Tradition Is Starting To Show Its Heart!

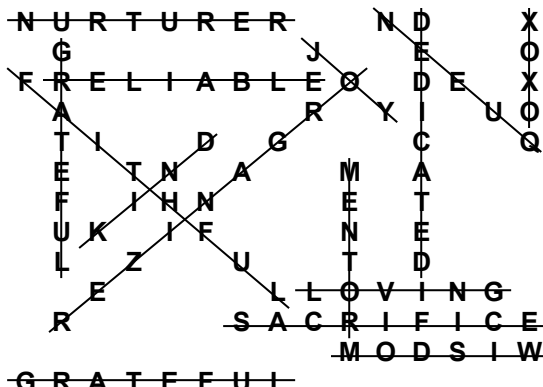
