Paint Project Update

Progress continues to be made on the project of painting the houses and the community buildings. The HOA Board has approved the paint contractor to do the work and the contract has been reviewed and approved by our counsel’s office. The HOA Board was given a mandate by the community residents to permit homeowners to keep their present color or to provide choice of color for those who wanted a change.

Based upon the above mandate the HOA Board approved a color palette containing nine colors. This will give each homeowner the choice of three colors for their home. This palette was chosen after many hours of research by the Paint Task Force in consultation with a color consultant and staff from Benjamin Moore. The palette has colors which compliment one another and blends with our pavers and roof colors.

The next step will be the holding of Town Halls with presentations by the paint contractor and representatives from Benjamin Moore. They will answer questions on the paint process at each home and the pre-painting responsibilities of each homeowner. The Program Manager’s office has developed a computer program where each homeowner can submit their choice of color. Any assistance needed will be provided by the office staff. Further information will be provided by HOA Workshops, Board Meetings and e-blasts from the Manager’s Office.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I want to thank everyone who was involved in this process.

Treasurer's Report

The Finance Committee started working on the 2026 Budget in August. We are now meeting bi-monthly with the goal to finish in October. When the proposed 2026 Budget is complete it will go to the Board of Directors for approval and notice of the Directors meeting with a copy of the proposed Budget will be sent to each homeowner.

The Operating Budget has five major expense categories - Administrative, Property Insurance, Contracts for common areas, Repairs and Maintenance, and Utilities. Under separate categories we budget for CDD1 irrigation water pass thru, and the lawn maintenance and Fertilizer/Pest Control for the Capris, Carlyle and Oakmont homes.

The process to create a forecast for next year's expenses involves looking at our expenses over the last number of years as well as compiling amounts that will increase in 2026 such as insurance premiums and increases from vendors with whom we have contracts. Contracts that have built-in increases are easy enough to forecast but contracts that are coming up for renewal and expenses with no contract need a little more work.



From our Reserves we are forecasting payment for reconstruction of the sports courts and the paint project. We must also consider any other assets that will be coming to the end of useful life in 2026. Some major expenses, such as the paving of our roads, require special attention and need to be expensed over multiple years, so a little spending discipline needs to be in place, as our cash flow cannot overtake our contributions. Please watch for Notice of the Board of Directors meeting to approve the budget, which we hope you will attend.

Recent Updates To Our Community's Facilities

New shorter white lines have been added to parking spaces in the parking lot at the Clubhouse. These shorter lines designate golf cart parking spaces. Each parking spot can now be used by one automobile or two golf carts. Please park within the designated lines.



Additional pedestrian crosswalk lines have been added by Kevin (our maintenance tech) to the intersection of Dardanelle and Tradition Lakes Blvd. in order to improve visibility and the safety of pedestrians who cross at that intersection.



Kevin has also installed sound absorption panels around the three outside windows located in the Clubhouse Veranda room in response to "echoing" noise complaints by homeowners.



New outdoor benches with seat backs have been placed at various locations on common areas with each giving a great view of our lakes. These new benches are replacements for the original concrete benches that have shown some deterioration over time.

There's A New Sheriff In Town

I recently met with Sheriff Richard Del Toro, at his office on Midway Road. Del Toro, who was sworn in as Sheriff on January 7, 2025, had previously served 26 years with the PSLPD, retiring as Chief of Police last November. He has lived in PSL for 28 years, moving here when he and his wife, Daniela, married. The couple have two daughters, one of whom is a nurse in Tampa and the other is a college student in the area. Meeting with him gave me an opportunity to see just how passionate this family man is about St Lucie County, and making it the very best that it can be in terms of safety and quality of life.

Sheriff Del Toro takes pride in the fact that PSL has ranked as the safest large city in Florida for 13 years straight, despite the fact that the city grew from just under 75K residents to more than 250K residents, and at the same time, changed demographically from an elderly retirement city to a much younger community. Because he believes that safety is the foundation of every community, he hopes to replicate the safety standards that were achieved in the city, in the whole of St Lucie County.

Making St Lucie County the safest county in the state will be challenging because the Sheriff's department is not the same type of agency that the PSLPD is. Besides answering calls and doing follow ups, the Sheriff's department has a jail that houses 1,000 inmates and prepares 5,000 meals daily as well as providing laundry and medical services. There are about 300 employees that staff the jail. There is also a School Resource Division with 65

deputies keeping our campuses safe throughout the county. Deputies also provide law enforcement services to the court and jury system in SLC. The Department also includes Marine and Aviation units.

Sheriff Del Toro says to accomplish this, he has assembled an impressive team of names you may recognize: Paul Taglieri, who joins the Department after 26 years of working for the NY Mets, John Boldoc, former PSL Chief of Police, Greg Oravec, former Mayor and City Manager, and many others who have joined the department, overseeing a staff of more than 850.

Sheriff Del Toro's leadership style is driven by his strong convictions in his faith, family, and following the Golden Rule. He believes in complete transparency in all dealings between the Sheriff's department and the public. He thinks that every citizen deserves to live in a safe and prosperous community, and to be served by a law enforcement agency with the highest standards and values. He is elevating the Department into a purpose driven organization whose goal is to serve the people and treat them the way he would want to be treated. He is deeply involved with the community, serving on several boards and Foundations throughout the County. In his spare time, he likes to golf and watch Seinfeld re-runs.



Paul Taglieri toured me through the Sheriff's Department on my way out, and one thing struck me again and again. Every employee that crossed our path had big smiles, said hello and welcomed me to the Sheriff's Department. They all seemed so happy to be working there, apparently agreeing with Sheriff Del Toro, when he told me, "It's going great, I love it, I am really enjoying this."

Birds Of The Lakes

American Osprey

American Osprey, also known as Fish Hawk, are large raptors 2 feet in length with a wingspan 6 feet in width. They have white bellies and variegated brown underwings, with a white head and a brown line between their eyes.

Year-round residents of Florida, they are unique among raptors in that they are found around water feeding almost exclusively on fish that can commonly be seen clutched in their talons. They dive feet-first all the way into the water, getting soaked head to talon, and still fly away with their meal.



Ospreys possess a reversible outer toe that allows them to grab a fish with two toes in front and two toes behind. This is particularly helpful to them in grabbing slippery fish. In flight, its wings are arched.

Their nests are big stick structures often seen built atop a tall utility light pole. Males and females form long-term relationships that last as long as they live, usually 15-20 years. A successful nest produces 1-2 young. Nesting Osprey tend to hunt early in the morning, usually around dawn.
